We had a blessed Mass for Healing on Monday, March 11th. It was a simple Mass. We did not have praise and worship music, the readings came from the daily Mass, and the prayers over one another remained straight forward and unflashy. In the midst of that simplicity, God responded with healing and granted us a sense of charity and joy. Three people were willing to share how the Holy Spirit either diminished or eliminated pain they carried prior to that Mass for Healing. In one testimony, this person shared that the pain she experienced was at a 7 out of 10 in the hips and leg; during prayer she felt the power of the Holy Spirit as heat through her body, and then the pain completely went away. Praise the Mighty Name of Jesus! With tears of gratitude and joy, her testimony let us know that Jesus is present, he heals, and he loves us. A truly inspiring mo-

ment. And we are so thankful for what Jesus has done and is doing. And, that prayer that brought such healing happened through parishioners like yourself! So be not afraid. Jesus desires to use you for the Kingdom of God in powerful ways. We also heard from a young man who was willing to share his testimony of how he came into the Catholic Church two years ago. His was a beautiful witness to the power of Jesus Christ to deliver him from unbelief, sin, and spiritual warfare and draw him into the light and love of the Holy Trinity through Mary's intercession. Jesus and Mary make quite a team, wouldn't you say? *Then*, after the healing Mass, a few people remained afterwards to pray with one another unprompted. It was a wonderful sight to behold in church: people listened to each other's needs and then responded with compassion and prayer, and all that after a lengthy Mass. The Mass lasted longer than I had anticipated, we really didn't finish everything until about 8:30PM; but it was so worth the time! It is my hope that we will have the next Mass for Healing on April 15th in the larger church at St. Edward's at 6:30PM. The Mass might be two hours long...and people will want to pray with and for you at the Mass when you join.

On Thursday, March 21st at 6:30PM we will have a Jesus Night at St. Lucy's. The title for that night: "God's Desire to Heal." Many of us trust that God can heal. Many of us believe God wants to heal people. However, there's some "buts" and "what abouts" that can muddy the waters. There's even some spiritualities within the Catholic Church that will try and say that illness "can be a blessing from God." And what about "offering it [the suffering] up?" Those "buts" and "what abouts" will be a big part of the talk that night. And a short Q&A will follow. We will begin the talk with a St. Michael Chaplet from 6:30-6:49PM ET USA OH before the Blessed Sacrament. The night will conclude around 8/8:30PM. Bring your Bible and a friend; hey, bring two friends...

Remember, Lent culminates with Easter. The penitential practices we offer throughout Lent do not end with death, but with new life. Keep your eyes on Jesus. He loves you. He desires to bless you more than you could imagine.

Father, Forgive Them

The promise made by the LORD in the first reading is very bold. He says that all people shall know him, without having to be taught by others. He doesn't restrict the promise to only the holiest people: He says that the way people will know Him is through forgiveness of their sins. Remember, he is speaking to the Israelites, who had so many laws and commandments, they needed scribes and Pharisees to keep track of them. When they broke a commandment or law, they were isolated from the community. So the promise that God would place his law in their hearts meant they would be free to do God's will because they want to, not because they were feared punishment or rejection.

Jesus says something similar in today's gospel. He tells the disciples that his crucifixion would draw everyone to him. Now, Jesus' death showed that he took on the punishment for sins in place of us, who deserve it. In Luke's gospel he even prays for those who crucified him, asking God's forgiveness. (Lk 23:34) By dying on the cross, Jesus shows how much God loves us. By rising from the dead, he shows that we can rise from sin to a new life of faith and love.

O Blessed Saint Joseph, faithful guardian and protector of virgins, to whom God entrusted Jesus and Mary, I implore you by the love which you did bear them, to preserve me from every defilement of soul and body, that I may always serve them in holiness and purity of love. Amen.

Getting back to the first reading, we experience that promise when we bring our sins to God. When we forgive people who have hurt us, we also help them to experience that love. After all, if I can forgive someone, surely God will forgive them. We also help others to know God when we share or experience of being forgiven. Still not sure if God has forgiven you? The sacrament of Reconciliation gives us the assurance of God's forgiveness, as well as the experience. Along with the other sacraments, it helps us keep God's love in our hearts.
